

- **New WA food prep regulation impact on event logistics**
  - The new rules added a lot of complexity to Yule and significantly impacted our clean-up process afterwards
  - We will need to change some things moving forward so everyone can have a fun event while staying in compliance

- **Gold Key fabric purchases**
  - We have made \$563 so far from selling off the old Gold Key stock that needed to be replaced.
  - The plan is still to replace what we have sold off with new, standardized tunics and other items
  - The main issue with this plan is that tariffs on EU linen are currently 7-9%, and tariffs on Chinese linen are 10-30%
  - Jane has requested a vote on what fabric we should buy and what style of garments we should make
    - Discussion. We will proceed with the original plan of making t-tunics out of blue and yellow linen/cotton blend, while trying to get the best deal off the current market

## **New Year Celebrations Throughout Medieval Europe by Paullus Quinctilius Barbatius**

Medieval Europe greeted the New Year with a remarkable diversity of customs shaped by local calendars, Christian observance, and older seasonal traditions. Unlike the modern world's near-universal January 1st celebrations, the medieval "New Year" might fall on January 1st, March 25th (Lady Day), December 25th, or even Easter, depending on regional practices. As a result, the turning of the year was less a single moment and more a shifting season of renewal.

Where January 1st was observed, its Roman roots remained visible. Medieval writers still associated the month with Janus, the dual-faced guardian of thresholds, and the day became linked with reflection and new beginnings. Gift-giving (known as *étrennes*) was central to the celebration. Nobles exchanged extravagant presents such as jeweled ornaments, fine fabrics, or ceremonial weapons, while common households offered modest tokens of goodwill. In some courts, these New Year gifts carried political weight, signaling loyalty or favor.

Across northern Europe, New Year festivities blended into the broader Christmastide season. Feasting was universal: households prepared roasted meats, spiced dishes, and strong winter ale. Music, dancing, and communal games filled the long winter nights. The burning of the Yule log, meant to smolder for days, symbolizing continuity and protection, its embers sometimes saved to bless the coming year's hearth.

Customs of luck and divination were widespread. The practice of first-footing; the belief that the first visitor to cross a threshold after midnight determined the household's fortune, appears in medieval sources and persisted for centuries. People cast lots, read omens, or performed small rituals to secure prosperity, health, or good harvests.

Sound and light played important symbolic roles. Church bells rang out to mark the transition and to drive away misfortune. Candlelit processions illuminated dark streets, blending Christian devotion with older winter rites of light conquering darkness.

Some regions embraced theatricality and social inversion. Mumming and masked performances brought humor and mischief to the season, while the Feast of Fools, celebrated in certain cathedral towns, allowed brief, sanctioned disorder. Clerical hierarchies were parodied, roles were reversed, and laughter served as a communal release before the return to ordinary discipline.

The New Year also functioned as a moment of social and administrative renewal. Guilds reaffirmed their oaths, communities settled accounts, and households renewed bonds of service. These practical acts grounded the festivities in the rhythms of medieval life.

Taken together, medieval New Year celebrations reveal a world where sacred time, seasonal change, and communal joy intertwined; where the arrival of a new year was marked not by a single countdown but by a constellation of rituals expressing hope, community, and shared identity.
